CHILDREN TO RECEIVE BACKPACKS & SCHOOL SUPPLIES FROM WINS THANKS TO PARTNERSHIP

Inter Pipeline steps up to support back to school program for 350 local children in need

Calgary, Canada, August 21, 2015 - Thanks to Inter Pipeline, the WINS Backpack Program will once again be providing backpacks and school supplies to low-income children in Calgary. The partnership comes after Calgary-based Women In Need Society (WINS) put out a call to the community for assistance in early August.

Over 40 enthusiastic Inter Pipeline employees volunteered their time on Wednesday, spending the afternoon filling 350 backpacks with over \$20,000 worth of school supplies for students ranging from Kindergarten to Grade 12.

Since 2012, the WINS Backpack Program has provided more than 1,300 bags full of supplies to children in need in Calgary. These latest stuffed backpacks will be distributed by WINS this month.
